Can You Help Us with Our Church Tracker List in Your Region?



We need to update our church tracker, but lack the staff to check each listing. Pastors may move, a church's theology may no longer be consistently Free Grace, or a church may not want to be on our list any longer. Plus there are many Free Grace churches that have never been added to our list.

Here's how you can help: add and subtract. You can check out the churches in your state, area, or region. See if the email is current. See if the pastor listed is still the pastor. Do they still want to be on our list? That is part of the subtraction. If you find any that no longer should be on the list, let us know.

Addition comes by you talking to friends about it, as well as by checking the websites of churches in your state and region. If you find churches that may be Free Grace, call them or send them an email and find out. If they are, invite them to be on our church tracker and explain that we have 10,000 people on our mailing list, and many more who go to our website, and that people who move often use our list to find new churches. Have the pastor or church leadership send us a request and we will add them to the list.

Thank you all for your generous support. Because of the way we ended our fiscal year, we will be setting a larger budget for our next fiscal year, which runs from July 1, 2012 through June 30, 2013. We will be pursuing some exciting tasks like Bible study materials designed for 15 week classes (Sunday school, discipleship groups, home groups). We aim to develop classes on the books of the NT, the books of the OT, and the major areas of systematic theology.

We also are thinking about doubling the size of the magazine, from 16 to 32 pages. And we are in the process of hiring an IT person to help us update our database and our backup capabilities (which have been woefully inadequate). Your support makes this possible too.

We might be entering into a partnership with a Bible college in Israel and possibly a seminary in Europe or Africa.

We have a board meeting on August 4 in which we will nail down our budget and plans for this coming year. We appreciate your support and your prayers. Together we are making a big difference. Our commitment is to use funds given to us as though God Himself handed them to us directly. We realize to whom much is given, of him much will be required.

By the way, one difference your support has already made is that we were able to hire Shawn Lazar. He started June 1 and has made some nice improvements already. Maybe you noticed that the magazine had a different look and feel to it this time? That's because Shawn had some great ideas. And he plans to keep on improving things. In addition Grant has been working on our website. The changes he is making, which should go online by the end of July, are ones we think you will really appreciate.
